## THE SIX ABORIGINAL SEASONS

Include the first winter rains, the second rains (when germination begins), the season when wildflowers, wattle and gum trees bloom, the first warm weeks in November and December, the hottest weeks (characterised by bush fires and thunderstorms) and Wanyarang (autumn), the season when the land begins to cool.

TOTADGIN ROCK

The Golden Pipeline explores the history of the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme. Built at the dawn of the 20th Century under the direction of Irish-born engineer CY O'Connor, it sustains life and settlement, mining and agriculture in an inhospitable and arid land.

Drive yourself on a journey of discovery through the land served by the Pipeline. Experience the fascinating cultural and natural heritage of its 650 kilometres, much of which is located in the Wheatbelt. The National Trust has developed 25 significant sites along the route.

Start in the 1880s in the bag tent, stables, dairy and blacksmith's and go to the 1930s church, barber's shop, dressmaker's, wattle and daub cottage, printing press, post office, bank, schoolhouse, general store and tearooms. Heritage walk maps provided.
